



Randonnée Tours

Provence Cycling 6 Days

Summary

Length

6 days/5 nights, with 4 days cycling

Dates

Any start date between April 1 to October 31

We recommend you to start your trip on a Monday so that you can enjoy the provincial market in Vaison held every Tuesday

Level

45 km daily average (30 miles)

Some hills every day of minor to moderate difficulty. Extra km possible

Cycling in Northern Provence is a sensual experience. As you move slowly through the landscape smell the wild thyme and rosemary. Stop to admire the texture of olive trees against old stone walls. Taste fresh chèvre mingled with piquant tapenade. Listen to the splash of fountains in village squares lined with rustling plane trees. Cycle slowly and savour !

Itinerary



Day 1

Arrival in Vaison-la-Romaine. Visit the famous Roman ruins, then explore the medieval quarter perched

high on the opposite bank.

Day 2

A delightful day ride from Vaison takes you to the east, under the flank of Mont Ventoux. Surrounded by almond trees, Entrechaux nestles around a hilltop castle in ruins. Mollans-sur-Ouvèze clusters around a high-arched bridge marked on each side by a tower and a tiny chapel.

Day 3

Wind your way among the wine villages of the Dentelles de Montmirail, stopping to explore Sablet, Gigondas, and Vacqueyras. Séguret is an artists' colony, including makers of santons, delicate and detailed figurines in regional costumes. Spend the night outside Pernes-les-Fontaines or, if you have selected the luxe accommodations for this night, in the tiny town of Crillon-le-Brave.

Day 4

On a day ride from Pernes, search out the famous vineyards at Château-neuf-du-Pape. Explore Pernes-les-



Fontaines, with its twisting streets, houses painted in a rainbow of blues, pinks, and greens, and fountains gently splashing in squares lined by plane trees. If you're staying in Crillon-le-Brave, explore Bédoin and the vineyards sheltering in the shadow of Mont Ventoux.

Day 5

On to the beautiful Luberon Valley. Pedal past Petrarch's Fontaine de Vaucluse, then through Ménerbes, the village of Peter Mayle. Your destination is Gordes, a stunning perched town with artists' studios, cozy cafés and arcaded medieval lanes.

Day 6

There's time for a last stroll in Gordes before you depart on your next adventure.

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How to get there?

You start in Vaison-la-Romaine, a delightful town snuggled in green hills in the heart of Provence.

Vaison lies about 650 km southeast of Paris, due east of Orange.

Access is via either Orange or Avignon. Both can be reached via the TGV (the high speed rail network of France) and are only a three to four hour journey from Paris.

These towns can also be reached by air or from other gateway cities such as Lyon or Nice.

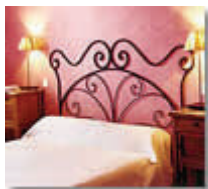
Transfer to Vaison is via public or private transportation.

Hôtel Le Burrhus

Vaison-La-Romaine

This hotel overlooks a pretty square right in the heart of Vaison. The hotel has been recently renovated, and often hosts art exhibits in the hotel's lounges.



L'Hermitage

Pernes-les-Fontaines

A charming hotel in a former family mansion, set in grounds with 100-year old trees. There are lovely gardens and a large swimming pool.



Hôtel Les Romarins

Gordes

A charming boutique hotel with views over Gordes, and an inviting pool and gardens. The town is only a five minute walk away.

L' Evêché

Vaison-La-Romaine

This is a huge house, but the proprietors only rent out five rooms to spend more time with their guests. There are great views of the old town and the castle, and each of the rooms is individually decorated.



Saint Barthelemy

Pernes-les-Fontaines

St Barthélémy is a delightfully restored 18th century farmhouse set in shaded parkland by a small stream and waterfall. The comfortable rooms are furnished in Provençal style. Large breakfasts include home-made pastries and jams.

Vaison-La-Romaine

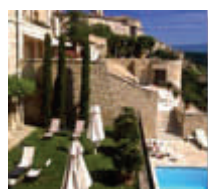
